
10 REDUCED INEQUALITIES

Uzbekistan's longstanding commitment to human rights and non-discrimination demonstrates its dedication to advancing SDG 10, which aims to reduce inequalities. From the early days of independence, Uzbekistan prioritized equal rights and well-being for its citizens, joining over 80 international agreements to support this goal. Recent strategic frameworks, such as the "Action Strategy 2017-2021", "Uzbekistan-2030", and the "New Uzbekistan Development Strategy 2022-2026", underscore this commitment through programs aimed at integrating international human rights standards into national laws and enforcement practices. However, despite substantial progress, Uzbekistan, like many countries, still faces significant challenges in combating discrimination due to factors like globalization, migration, and societal polarization, which exacerbate inequalities for vulnerable groups. The alignment with global treaties, such as the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and conventions targeting racial and gender-based discrimination, reinforces Uzbekistan's commitment to equality and its efforts to protect fundamental rights. By adhering to these international standards and prioritizing non-discrimination policies, Uzbekistan is advancing SDG 10 targets to create a more inclusive and just society, tackling both social and economic inequalities. both social and economic inequalities.

Reducing income inequalities

Providing full scholarships to low-income directly supports students SDG 10 by promoting social and economic inclusion and helping to reduce inequality within and among countries. When vulnerable groups gain access to higher education without financial barriers, they have a better chance of realizing their potential, securing better jobs, and improving their socioeconomic status. Scholarships for students help bridge low-income educational gap, which is often a root cause of intergenerational poverty and inequality. By investing in these students, institutions not only empower individuals but also contribute to building a more equitable society where everyone, regardless of background, has the opportunity to succeed. This aligns with SDG 10's targets by ensuring equal opportunities, reducing income inequalities, and promoting social mobility for all.



REDUCING LOW-INCOME

The university provided specific support to vulnerable groups of the population (lowincome students) to provide the opportunity to study on the basis of a full scholarship.
